With its around twenty staff, the planning office Space Syntax moved into a building planned by David Chipperfield in 1986 for CDT, the users at that time. The move provided the opportunity to adapt the rooms to current needs and thus express the company's intrinsic goals. Evidence-based planning of urban projects is the basic service provided by the company and this was also applied to the plans for their own offices, albeit on a small scale. The result is a multiplicity of spaces with open structures. The idea was to create a situation where staff, management, visitors and customers would be able to meet, exchange information and concentrate on their work. in an ideal setting.

As the employees engaged in creative work are the company's most valuable asset, ten design principles were used as a basis in the case of this (its own) project. In addition to the attractive mid-town location, bench workstations with their own hot desks, a friendly daylight atmosphere, sufficient storage space, a multifunctional reception and waiting area, ergonomically effective fittings and fixtures, ecological sustainability and an overall non-hierarchical spacial structure are among the advantages achieved.
